About the Programme

Made in Scotland is a curated showcase that promotes high quality music, theatre and dance from Scotland-based artists, to international promoters and audiences at the [Edinburgh Festival Fringe](#) each year.

Made in Scotland is supported by the Scottish Government's Festivals Expo Fund – awarded to the Edinburgh Festival Fringe Society to deliver this programme. The funding supports the Made in Scotland Showcase as well as Onward International Touring.

Made in Scotland Showcase Fund 2027

Three levels of funding are available to help support presentation at the Fringe of shows that have been created in Scotland. The work can be new or existing work that is artistically ambitious and demonstrates strong international onward potential. All applicants should focus on articulating their international ambitions and the international appeal for the show being presented.

Eligibility

- Applications can come from individual artists, companies, organisations, promoters and/or venues.
- All applicants must be based in Scotland. It is not necessary for your entire team to currently be based in Scotland, but the lead applicant and lead artist(s) should be based in Scotland and the work should have been/be produced in Scotland.
- Student and non-professional companies are not eligible to apply.
- Organisations already in receipt of Creative Scotland Regular Funding or other Targeted Funds are eligible to apply, but need to clearly demonstrate the additional benefits that support from Made in Scotland will present.
- Applications can be from companies new to Made in Scotland, or those who have taken part previously but are applying with a new show.

Funding

The total budget available for the Made in Scotland 2027 programme will be £300,000.

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Applicants can apply for one of three fixed levels of funding. These levels are:

- £5,000
- £15,000
- £25,000

You must provide a comprehensive budget, detailing overall expenditure, box office projections, and any additional sponsorship/fundraising income whether secured or projected. You should bear in mind that Made in Scotland **cannot** be your only source of funding. While your budget is not formally scored by the selection panel, it does help them to get an understanding of the scale of the work and considerations for touring – which can be a key driver of the panel's decision-making.

Below is a summary of how many applications were received over the last three years, and how many awards were issued: 2024 = 109 applications, 14 shows awarded 2025 = 101 applications, 16 shows awarded 2026 = 121 Applications, 18 shows awarded

Support

Those selected to be part of Made in Scotland are responsible for producing their own show. They will receive support and advice from the Made in Scotland Team to help them prepare for participation in the programme, including advice on marketing, networking and plans beyond the Fringe.

Question 2: International touring ambition and logistics

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Please detail your international touring strategy for this show, including any wrap-around activity and environmental considerations. This may include the size of your tour entourage and kit, any existing tour dates that you have in place for this work, context around your selected regions of interest, or current interest from international bookers. Tips: This fund is to help artists to present work at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe that is ready for international export. The panel want to know what your international touring experience and ambitions are for this piece and how this would work in practice. Please detail if you have existing contacts in the places you are aiming to tour to.

Question 3: Equality, Diversity and Inclusion

How will you ensure that your project is inclusive and accessible throughout both the rehearsal and development process, and public performances? (500 words max) *

Tips: The panel primarily want to know how your project will be inclusive and accessible when presenting at the Edinburgh Fringe. You are welcome to also talk about your onward touring plans for this too.

Please confirm that you will comply with the following:

- That you will pay at minimum the Real Living Wage to all directly employed staff, 16-17-year-old workers, and contracted and agency staff from the start of the funded period.
- That [Effective Voice](#) for workers is in place in the organisation. This can be aspects of 'Individual' voice (for organisations of fewer than 21 workers) and aspects of 'Collective' voice (for those with 21 workers or more).
- That your workforce representative has agreed that all workers employed within the organisation have access to effective voice channel.

Non-funded award

This year we're piloting an optional non-funded award for the Made in Scotland showcase. This will act as a secondary opportunity for applicants who have applied but are not selected for the funded showcase. We know that not every deserving project can be funded, and feedback we've received over the years suggests that a non-funded award could still prove valuable to companies pursuing professional international ambitions.

The non-funded award gives applicants the option to receive the same status, network access, mentoring and promotional opportunities as funded projects, but without the cash

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funding. This is an opt-in process, and your choice to do so will be hidden from the panel until after funded places and reserves are decided, so it will have no bearing on your chances of being funded.

Things to note:

- There is no obligation to apply for a non-funded award if you feel you would not be able to take part in the showcase without funding.
- Opting into this process does not guarantee your inclusion in the showcase. The panel will still assess and consider whether your application is the right fit for Made in Scotland 2027.
- There are no maximum or minimum limits on non-funded awards – the panel may select several shows for non-funded awards, or they may select none.
- There will be no distinction made between funded and non-funded shows in the showcase programme or in our communications to industry delegates, however this information will be made available publicly as a requirement of the showcase being government-funded.
- Whether an applicant has opted to apply for a non-funded award will not be shared with the panel or chairperson until the selection process for funded awards is complete – and will initially be known only to administrative staff..

How this works in practice: Complete this application and select the level of funding you would require from Made in Scotland. The panel will assess your application on this basis.

Should you be in a position where you would still plan to present your work at the Fringe regardless of the outcome of this fund, and would benefit from the wrap-around support and profiling that participation in the showcase provides, you can opt in to be considered for the non-funded award.

The panel will be aware at the start of the process that non-funded award applications exist, but will not know who has opted in to be considered for this until after the final showcase has been selected, meaning that this cannot influence their decision. The panel chair will also not know who has opted in.

Once the showcase has been selected, the chair and panel will then find out which unselected shows have opted in to be considered for a non-funded award. The panel will then discuss these shows and whether they should be included in the showcase with a non-funded award.

This is a trial process for Made in Scotland 2027. After next year's showcase has concluded, we will assess the results of the trial and factor this into our planning for future showcases.
